A SURPRISING VICTORY

- I It was called the greatest surprise in the history of sport. In 2016, Leicester City Football Club won the English Premier League, even though at the start of the season the small club had begun with 5,000-1 odds to win the title.
- II Leicester City's win was particularly remarkable because the most successful clubs in the Premier League, like Arsenal, Manchester City and Chelsea, are paid huge sums of money in return for the rights to broadcast their games. As a result, they are able to acquire the most talented players and smaller, less wealthy clubs find it difficult to compete with them. Before the 2016 season, Leicester City spent under £55 million on their team as opposed to the £420 million invested by Manchester City.
- III So how was it that a team with no big names managed to win the league? Some experts suggest that a large part of their success was due to the fact that they managed to avoid injuries amongst their players. What is more, unlike some of their rivals, they were not participating in a European competition and as a result, they were able to concentrate all their energies on the Premier League.
- IV There can be no doubt that good coaching and great teamwork also played a central role in their success. Spectators could not help but notice the amazing team spirit demonstrated by the players and the fact that they seemed to be enjoying themselves immensely on the pitch.
- V Yet there are those who have another explanation for the rise of Leicester City. In 2012, archeologists from the University of Leicester discovered the remains of England's King Richard III buried under a local car park. After digging up his bones, he was ceremonially reburied in Leicester Cathedral in March 2015. And it was then that the local football team started winning.
- VI Whatever the reason for Leicester City's unlikely rise, there can be no doubt that their story will be talked about for many years to come. Leicester City captured the imagination of people all over the world and proved that the impossible is sometimes possible.
