There are different types of words that end in ED.

Past Tense Verbs

- ✓ played
- ✓ lived
- ✓ rained

Past Participles

- ✓ played
- ✓ worked
- ✓ snowed

Adjectives

- ✓ bored
- ✓ tired
- ✓ relaxed

General Rule

In general, we just add -ED to the end of a regular verb or word.

- ✓ rain → rained
- ✓ cook → cooked
- ✓ wait → waited



Verbs ending in Consonant + E

Just add -D to the end.

- ✓ live → lived
- ✓ dance → danced
- ✓ smile → smiled
- ✓ love → loved



Consonant + Vowel + Consonant

Ends in a C + V + C and the final syllable is stressed, we double the final consonant.*

- ✓ stop → stopped
- ✓ plan → planned
- ✓ admit → admitted



* Exception: When the word ends in W, X, or Y.

Words ending in W, X, or Y

Do NOT double the final letter at the end of a word when it is W, X, or Y.

- ✓ play → played
- ✓ fix → fixed
- ✓ snow → snowed



Last syllable is NOT stressed

Two or more syllables and final syllable is NOT stressed, do NOT double final letter.

- ✓ happen → happened
- ✓ open → opened
- ✓ visit → visited



Vowel + Letter L

🇬🇧 Double the final L

🇺🇸 Do NOT double the final L unless stressed

- ✓ equal → equalled (UK) / equaled (US)
- ✓ travel → travelled (UK) / traveled (US)
- ✓ control → controlled (UK) / controlled (US)

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Pronunciación '-ED'

'-ED' se pronuncia → /t/

cuando la palabra acaba con un sonido sordo (p, k, ch, sh, s, f, h y θ)

'-ED' se pronuncia → /d/

cuando la palabra acaba con un sonido sonoro (vocales y estos sonidos consonánticos: b, g, z, v, m, n, l, r, w, j, ð)

'-ED' se pronuncia → /ɪd/

cuando la palabra acaba con 't' o 'd'

EJEMPLOS sonido /t/

ASK: asked → /ɑːskt/

KISS: kissed → /kɪst/

STOP: stopped → /stɒpt/

WATCH: watched → /wɒtʃt/

EJEMPLOS sonido /d/

BEG: begged → /bɛgd/

CALL: called → /kɔːld/

DIE: died → /daɪd/

RAIN: rained → /reɪnd/

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EJEMPLOS sonido /ɪd/

ACT: acted → /ˈæktɪd/

ADD: added → /ˈædɪd/

VISIT: visited → /ˈvɪzɪtɪd/

WANT: wanted → /ˈwɛntɪd/
