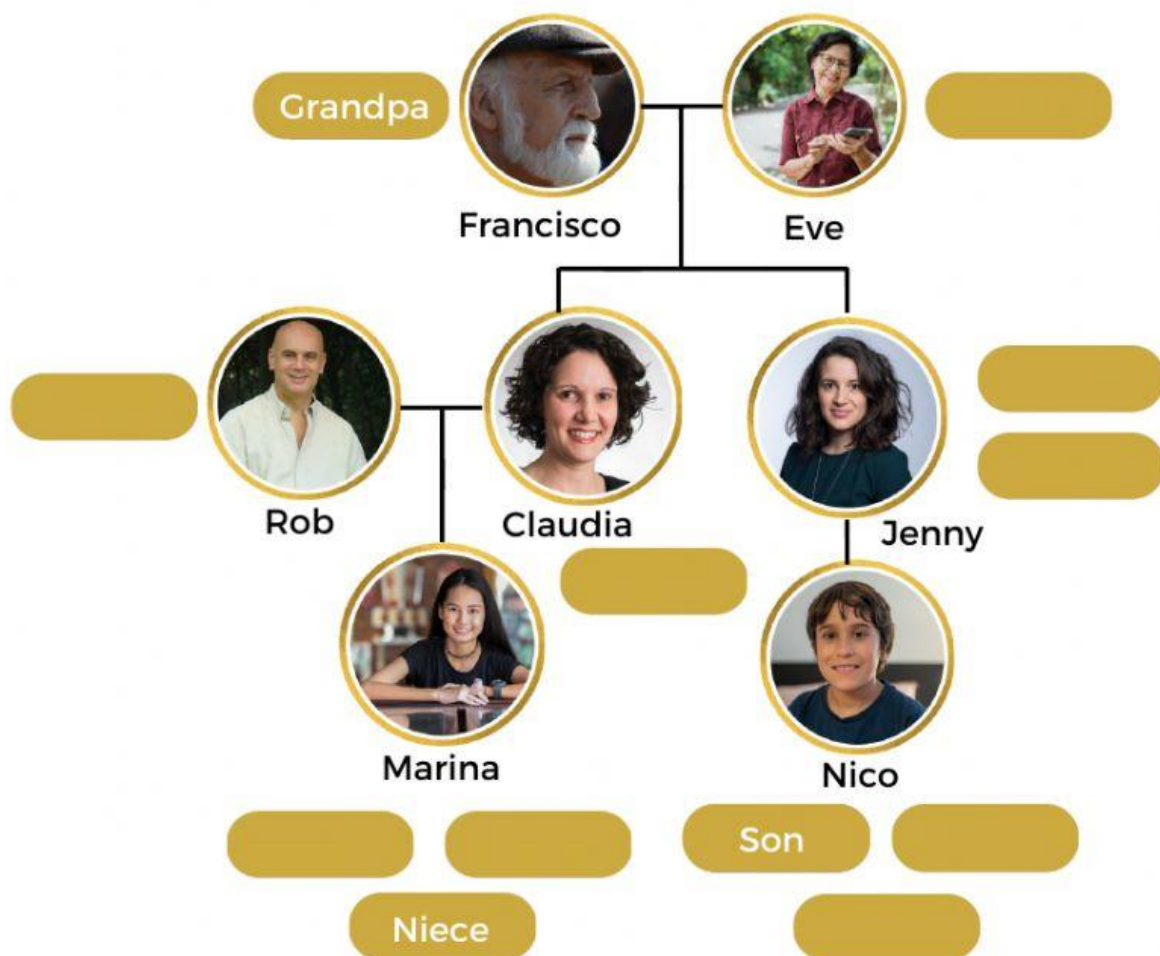

Indicating possession

Read these statements.



Francisco is Eve's **Husband**



Nico is Jenny's **Son**



Rob is Marina's **Father**

Genitive Case

1. We use the apostrophe + s ('s) to indicate **possession** over relationships or objects.

Nico is Jenny's **Son**

Nico is **her** son.

2. We put the "s" after the possessor's name.

Nico is **Jenny's** **Son**

3. Don't confuse it with abbreviations of verb to be.

Nico's Jenny's **Son**

4. We use s' with regular nouns, but 's with irregular nouns.

This is my parents' **house**

This is my parents' **toys**

This is the men's **bathroom**

This is the children's **room**

5. We use Whose ...? to ask about possessions?

Whose bag is this?

It's Maria's **bag**
