

Probability phrases: informal to formal.

What's the correct idea & better expression?

1. I'm **totally sure** the wedding will be on August twenty first.

1. The wedding **will probably be** on August twenty first.
2. The wedding **may be** on August twenty first.
3. The wedding **will definitely be** on August twenty first.

2. I'm **not really sure** I'll get the job.

1. It **seems unlikely that** I'll get the job.
2. I'll **definitely** get the job.
3. I **probably won't** get the job.

A. **There's no way that Ken will** arrive by noon.

- A. Ken **may not** arrive by noon.
- B. Ken **probably won't** arrive by noon.
- C. **There's no chance** Ken will arrive by noon.

B. **Maybe** Ana will pass the course.

- A. It's **possible** Ana will pass the course.
- B. Ana **will definitely** pass the course.
- C. It **seems unlikely** Ana will pass the course.
