

Plant-based milk has in popularity in the past decade. People are choosing vegan diets and sustainably produced food. One reason for this is the global rise in the prices of food. This has by Russia's war with Ukraine. The war has the costs of fertilizer by an 80%. Many countries rely on Russia for over 50 per cent of their fertilizer supply.
