Butterflies take flight in Mexico



I am visiting Michoacán's forests on a sunny February morning and I am witnessing an astonishing spectacle: hundreds of millions of orange-black wings flexing then fluttering as vast clouds of monarch butterflies take to the air.

Each winter up to a billion of these incredible insects migrate thousands of miles from northeastern North America to the warmer climes of Mexico, specifically, Michoacán Province's Oyamel fir forests, some of which are now protected as the Monarch Butterfly Biosphere Reserve. Here the monarchs breed before returning to their summer grounds far, far to the north.

Summer is around the corner. I have plenty of plans to do. I am flying to Philippines next Monday. I am planning to see whale sharks. Did you know that whale sharks are the world's biggest fish? Growing up to 13m long. Once I arrive there, here are my plans. First, I am renting a car and going to Donsol. Donsol, a coastal village at the bottom of LUZON island, is one of the world's best places to do it. Then, I'm taking an eco-operator run boat trip, and looking for this amazing creature. I heard that Snorkeling alongside one is more like finning with a slow-moving train than a living creature. During whale shark season, which runs November to June (peaking February to May), there might be more than 10 whale sharks in the water at a time, so taking advantage of it, we are taking thousands of pictures.
