How much sleep is healthy for a dog? The answer depends on the dog's age, size and breed, exercise level, environment, and __1__ they get to the deep sleep stage. Puppies and senior dogs need 18 to 20 hours of sleep a day. On average, adult dogs need eight to fourteen hours of sleep each day. However, a dog's size makes a difference in their sleep needs. Large dog breeds need up to 18 hours of sleep a day, while small breeds need 14–16 hours. Medium-sized breeds should get ten to fourteen hours of sleep daily.

If dogs don't get enough physical activity during the day, they may have extra energy at bedtime and find __2__ hard to go to bed. A dog's surroundings can also have an impact on their sleep. With a new living situation, family member, or pet __3__ into the home, dogs might not sleep well. They might also get __4__ if loud noises such as fireworks occur. Since dogs often take short naps, they don't spend as much time in the rapid eye movement (REM) stage of sleep. Both people and dogs have dreams during REM sleep!

If you live in a big, busy city, you likely know exactly what it's like to breathe in polluted air. On

particularly bad days, the air outside can seem thick and sour. Your eyes itch, and you struggle for a fresh breath of air. But once inside, shut off from the exhaust of cars and factories, you finally feel safe. 1

According to the US Environmental Protection Agency, the levels of indoor air pollution can be two to five times higher than those outdoors.
