The Musée d'Orsay in Paris is one of the most famous art galleries in the world. <sup>1</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ of the artworks on display are French, from the period 1848 to 1914. <sup>2</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ museum is worth visiting, but <sup>3</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ sections are more popular than others. The most famous works on display are the "impressionist" paintings.
