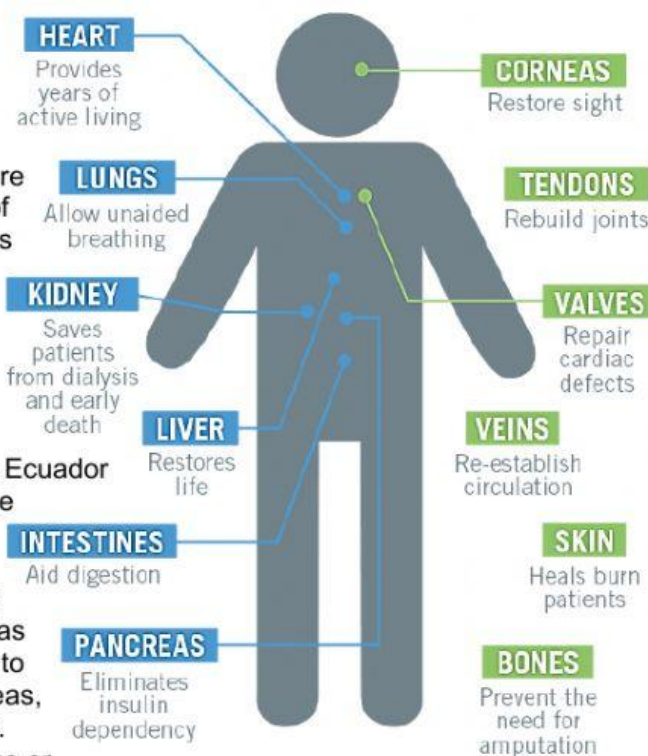

Organ Donation

- When you decide to be an organ and tissue donor, you open up a world of possibilities for others.
- Every year about 104 people receive organ transplants. However, more organs and tissues are needed than are available, and the number of people waiting for life-saving transplants grows larger every day.
- One organ and tissue donor can save up to 8 lives and enhance the lives of more than 75 others.
- A lot of people are waiting for a transplant that will save their lives, and hundreds of thousands more wait for life-enhancing tissue transplants. In Ecuador alone, there are more than 1,707 people on the waiting list.
- Life-saving organs for transplant include the heart, kidneys, lungs, liver, pancreas, and intestines. You can also donate tissues such as bone, ligaments, and tendons, which are used to repair injured or diseased joints and bones. Corneas, heart valves, veins, and skin may also be donated.
- Anyone can decide to be a donor, regardless of age or health. If you are under age 18, you will need a parent or guardian's signature. Remember, you have the power to save lives.
