FIRST CONDITIONAL

If + present simple, WILL + infinitive	Will + infinitive if + present simple
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - For present or future situations that are possible and probable. - For promises or to give warnings.

As soon as *I have enough money, I will buy you the sneakers.*

When *we arrive at the airport, our parents will meet us.*

*You won't be cold **as long as** you wear enough warm clothes.*

By the time *Dad gets home, it will be too late to go to the supermarket.*

Provided that *you are feeling better tomorrow, we will go to the beach in the morning.*

Only if *you're feeling well tomorrow, we will go to the beach.*

SECOND CONDITIONAL

If + past simple, WOULD + infinitive	WOULD + infinitive if + past simple
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Imaginary situations in the present. 	

- Present or future situations which are impossible or improbable.

- Unreal situation in the past.
- Hypothetical situation in the past (the situation didn't occur)
