

## **FIRST CONDITIONAL**

### **Use**

We use the first conditional when we want to express a situation which is likely to happen. We refer to a real possibility. When the condition clause goes first, we have to use a comma.

### **Structure**

CONDITION	RESULT
If we save money,	we will go on holiday this summer.

RESULT	CONDITION
We will go on holiday	if we save money.

- 14- Mary .....(go) out for dinner if she .....(find) another friend.
