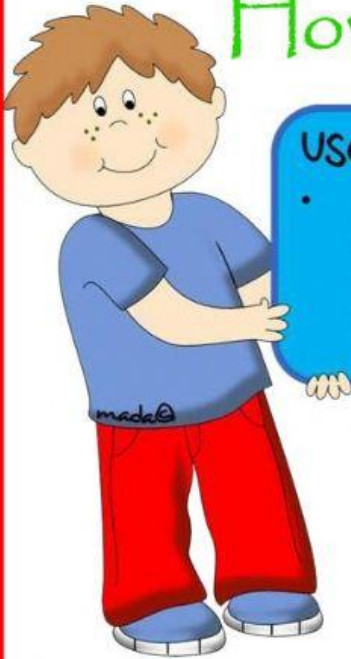

Our history teacher doesn't usually give us homework.



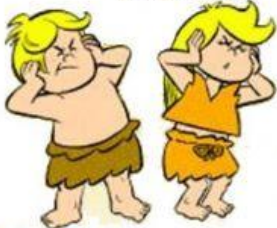

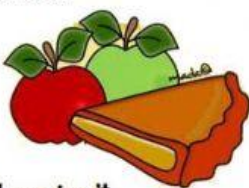
