What does it look like? / Can you tell me what it looks like?

When we report a missing bag in an airport, the officer at the lost luggage counter will ask us *what the bag looks like* (what colour it is, what material it is made of, what size it is, etc.)

Example:

Traveller: Excuse me. My suitcase is missing. What should I do?

Officer: Don't worry. Can you tell me what it looks like?

Traveller: Well, it's a large blue suitcase. It's made of hard plastic... Oh! And it has a lock, four wheels and one pocket.

Officer: Perfect. Could you please fill out this form?
