## Art Made of . . . Cheese?

Artists are always looking for new and interesting ways to express themselves in their art. Sometimes they choose to use interesting materials. Sculptor Sarah Kaufmann is a good example. She carves her sculptures out of cheese!

### A Visit to the Museum
