- You can also use a reflexive pronoun for emphasis.

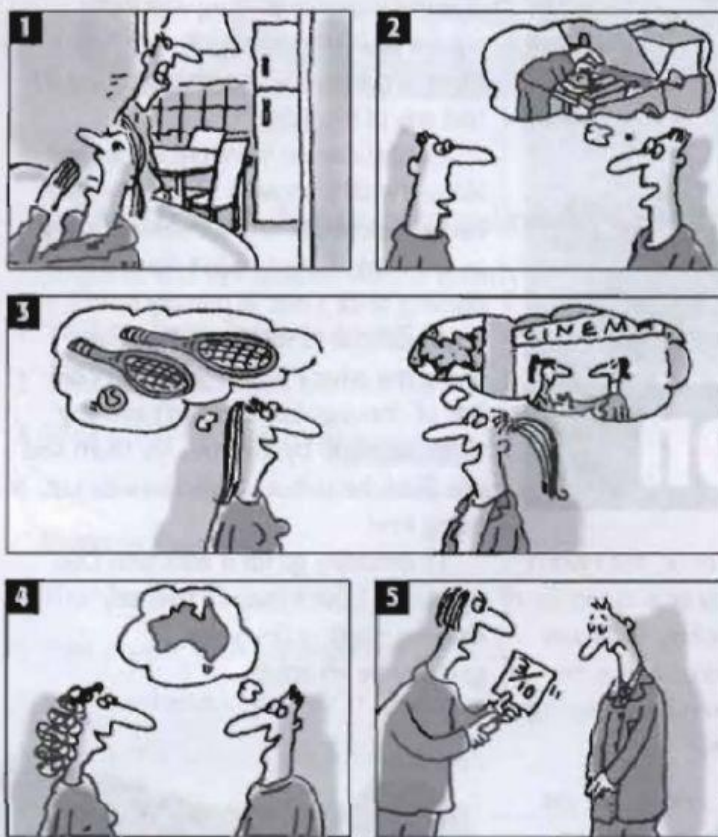
