

MUSIC GENRES IN ENGLISH: WHAT IS YOUR FAVOURITE?

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If you want to talk about music in English, one of the first questions you need to answer is: What kind of music do you like? To answer this, you need to know the words for different genres (types) of music in English. Read on to find out how to explain your favourite music genre in English.

Glossary:

Beat = Rhythm Loud = noisy



Classical. Some famous classical music composers are Mozart, Beethoven, Vivaldi, etc. Classical music is often performed by an **orchestra** (big group of musicians), a **choir** (a group of singers) or a **soloist** (just one person). People usually say a '**piece**' of classical music, they don't say a 'tune' or 'song'.

Jazz and blues are both originally from the USA. Jazz has a strong rhythm. The melody has different scales. Charlie Parker and Miles Davis are famous jazz artists. **Blues** is a style of music famous for sad people. Blues music has stories of the difficult lives of the people.

Folk music is the traditional music of a particular group of people. **Country music** is one of the famous kinds of folkloric music and is popular in many parts of the world.

Pop. Every country in the world has its own pop stars. '**Pop**' is short for '**popular**' music – it is the most popular or common form of music in most countries. Wherever you go in the world, it's easy to hear music from famous **pop stars** like Madonna, Michael Jackson or Lady Gaga.

Rock music is famous for being loud! Rock groups use electric guitars, bass and drums to create music with a strong beat and lots of energy. There are lots of sub-genres (styles) of rock, for example **metal**, **punk** and **prog-rock**.

Dance music is the kind of music you usually hear in clubs and bars. It has a strong beat, is often repetitive, and is perfect for dancing to. Similar to rock, there are many different styles of dance music. They are sometimes slow, or sometimes fast, but they all get your feet moving!

Rap is different to most music genres. Rappers speak, they don't sing. The words rhyme, in a similar way to a poem, and follow the rhythm of music.

Alternative. When the music you like doesn't correspond to one of these categories, it is probably **alternative**. They combine different styles and only a small group of people like it.

So, what is your favourite music genre and what kind of music person are you?

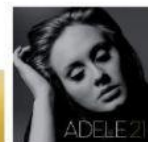
