Policeman	Hello! How can I help you?
Pam and Martin	Hello! To see a note in today's newspaper about Alan Rook.
Policeman	Yes, To look for him/ to have got a lot of money with him
P&M	Well, To see one man on Saturday/ to look like Alan Rook
Policeman	Where/ to see him?
Pam	Well, first To see him in the garden/ to want to take a picture of Martin/to finish the film on my camera
Martin	Yes, but then A man/ to pass by/ to stand next to me/to take a photo of him too.

Policeman	Ok, I see. To see him again?
P&M	To see him at the bus station/ to get on a bus to Aberdeen, Scotland/about 5 o'clock.
Policeman	OK, Cambridge, bus station at 5 o'clock. To have a suitcase or a bag with him?
Martin	Yes, To have a rucksack and a tent on his back
Pam	After that To come home/ to get our photos on Tuesday/ to see the last photo and the photo in today's newspaper.
Martin	In the newspaper Not to have a beard/ to have glasses. In our photo To have a two-day beard, sunglasses and a blue hat.
Pam	Martin To take the newspaper and draw a two-day beard, sunglasses and a blue hat
Martin	Yes, so the man in the photo To look like Alan Rook/ to come to the police station/ to want to help you find him
Policeman	Thank you, guys, a lot. I will call the police officer in Aberdeen.
P&M	You're welcome! We were happy to help you!
