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GLOBAL ENGLISH 7: UNIT 1 – MAKING CONNECTIONS GRAMMAR 1

A. GRAMMAR

PAST SIMPLE (Thì quá khứ đơn)

I - Cấu trúc

	Với động từ “to be”	Với động từ thường
Câu khẳng định	S + was/ were + O	S + V2/ V-ed + O
Câu phủ định	S + was/ were + not + O	S + did not + V-inf
Câu nghi vấn	(Từ để hỏi) + was/ were + S + O? - Yes, S + was/were. - No, S + wasn't/weren't.	(Từ để hỏi) + did + S + V-inf + O? - Yes, S + did. - No, S + did not/didn't.

***Note:** V-inf = Verb infinitive: Động từ nguyên mẫu; S = Subject: Chủ ngữ;
O = Object: Tân ngữ; V2/V-ed : Động từ thì quá khứ đơn

II - Cách dùng

- Diễn tả một hành động **đã xảy ra và chấm dứt** tại một **thời điểm nhất định trong quá khứ**.
- Diễn tả những **hành động xảy ra kế tiếp nhau trong quá khứ**.
- Diễn tả **thói quen trong quá khứ và giờ không còn nữa**.

III - Dấu hiệu nhận biết

- yesterday, last + (week/ month/ year, ...), etc.
- ago (2 days ago, a year ago), in + thời gian trong quá khứ, etc.

IV - Past simple with regular verbs (thì quá khứ đơn với động từ có quy tắc)

- Các động từ có quy tắc sẽ tuân theo một mô hình chia động từ nhất quán. Ở thì quá khứ đơn, chúng ta thêm đuôi **-ed** vào sau các động từ có quy tắc.

Ex: Yesterday, I **jumped** higher.

- Có ba cách phát âm đuôi -ed là: /ɪd/, /t/ hay /d/. Đuôi -ed được phát âm ra sao phụ thuộc vào âm kết thúc của động từ là **âm vô thanh** hay **âm hữu thanh**.

Cách phát âm	/ɪd/	/t/	/d/
Các âm tận cùng	/t/ hay /d/	/tʃ/, /s/, /k/, /f/, /p/, /θ/, /ʃ/	các âm còn lại
Ví dụ	wanted /wɒn.tɪd/ needed /niː.dɪd/	watched /wɒtʃ/ missed /mɪs/	lived /lɪvd/ allowed /əˈlaʊd/

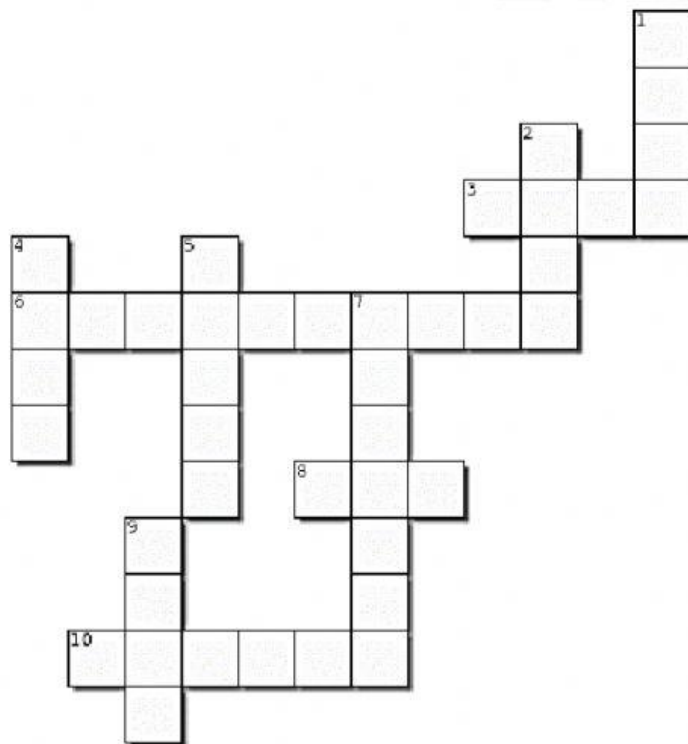
