## Working from home: a dream now a reality.

Sujit Patel is a graphic designer with a well-known publishing company. He lives in South London and, for the last 3 years, he's been working from home. He says he prefers it because he can spend more time with his family and have a better **work-life balance**. Sujit isn't alone: in Britain, there are more than 2.1 million people who work from home at present rather than in the office. This is almost as twice as it was 10 years ago.

This trend is growing all around the world. But what are the reasons for it? The main reason is technological: easy access to broadband and the availability for videoconferencing. This way enables people to use their home as an office in an efficient and cost-effective way.

Other reasons are the benefits that it brings to both **employers** and **employees**: office space is costly, so if a company can reduce its **workstations**, it may be able to move to a smaller site. Employees often work better at home: travelling can be **time-consuming** and tiring. Many workers save a lot of time and can start the day fresh and work more productively.

Sujit says: "I have been working from home since my son was born and have been really enjoying it. But working from home requires special skills: self discipline and **time management**. I've known my boss and colleagues for years, which really helps because you have to trust each other. You also need to have regular contact, by phone, email, text messages or videoconferencing. Or you need to take regular trips to the office. Otherwise you miss out on a lot of the social part of work."

Not everyone agrees with Sujit though. This is a response to a question in an online forum about homeworking: "The only people who can work from home are those who do unnecessary work. Can surgeons work from home? Ambulance drivers? Firefighters? if you can do your work full-time, then you have a pointless job". Fortunately for Sujit and the 2.1 million like him, not many people think like this person!
