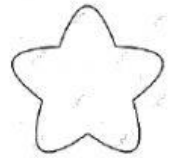

Annie's Gift

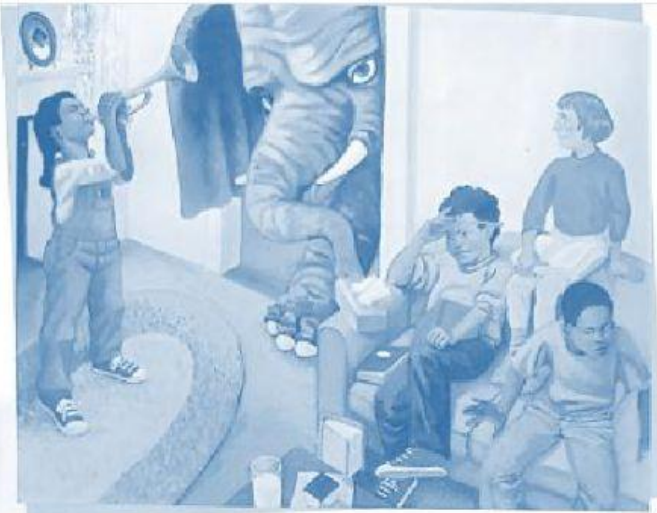

Instructions: Read the following pages. Scan for information to answer the questions.



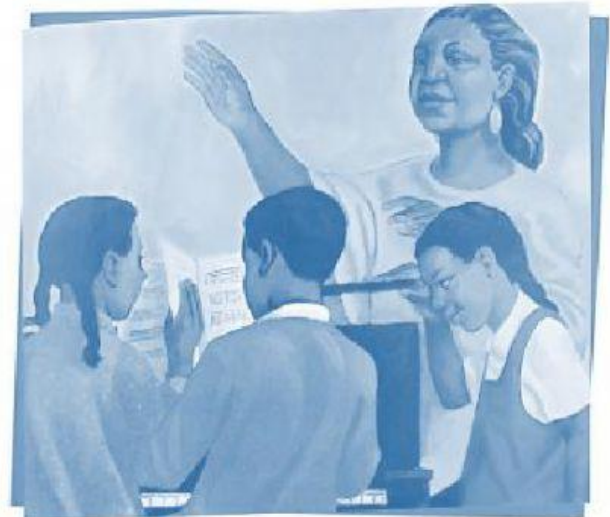
