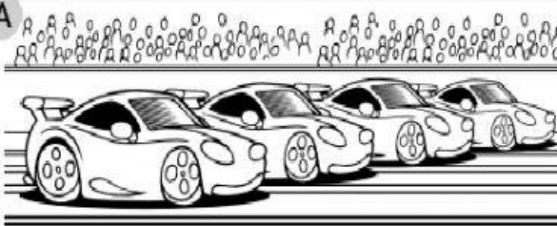

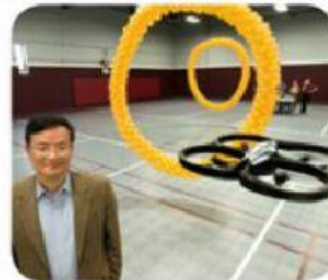
Newsround by Kayla
