The Parking Ticket

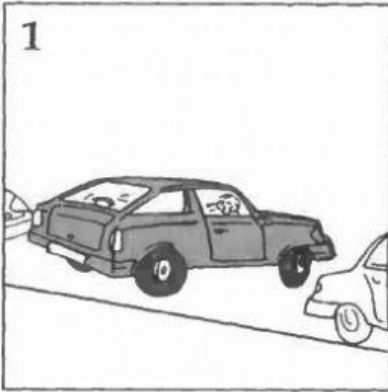

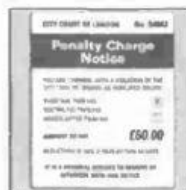
