DEMONSTRATIVE ADJECTIVES

- Use **THESE** and **THOSE** with plural count nouns.
- Use **THIS** and **THAT** with mass nouns and singular count nouns.

VOCABULARY	SINGULAR	PLURAL
book (near)	this book	these books
pencil (far)	that pencil	those pencils



DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUNS

Demonstrative pronouns have the same form as demonstrative adjectives; this, that, these, and those. Demonstrative pronouns are also used to identify specific people or things, but are used as pronouns, without the nouns that they refer to.

eg.:

- What is this?
- this is big than that one.
- I like that.

DEMONSTRATIVE ADJECTIVES AND PRONOUNS

THIS, THAT, THESE and THOSE can either be demonstrative pronouns or demonstrative adjectives.

Eg: Those books are expensive. - **DEMONSTRATIVE ADJECTIVES**

but: Those are expensive. - **DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUNS**

That is an amazing idea.
