LIVE YOUR DREAM

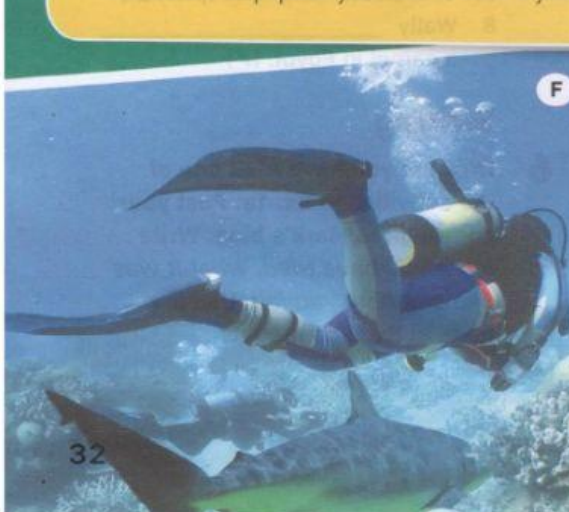
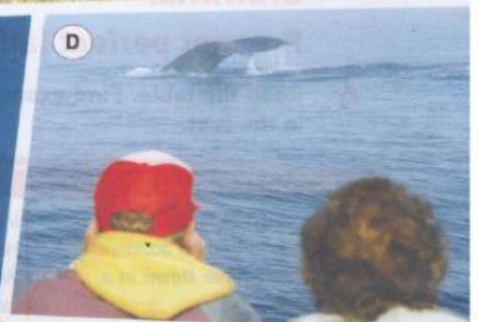
