Songkran Festival

Songkran is a Thai traditional New Year which starts on April ๑๓ every year and lasts for ๓ days. Songkran festival on April ๑๓ is Maha Songkran Day, April ๑๔ is Wan Nao which is the day after and April ๑๕ is Wan Thaloeng Sok which the New Year begins. Songkran means “movement” or “changing” since according to Thai astrology, the sun will move into a new sign of the Zodiac on this day.

Songkran is also called the “Water Festival”. Water is believed to wash away all bad **things**.

Thus, it is a time for cleaning; houses, villages, temples and spirit houses. In the Thai tradition,

the New Year begins early in the morning when people give **food** to monks. After that, they let caged animals free, especially birds and fish.

Elders and parents will be visited and respected by their children and grandchildren. The young pour perfumed water over their elder’s hands, they in return, wish them good health, happiness and **riches**.

This is called “Rod Nam Dam Hua”.

April ๑๔ is called “Family Day”. In the afternoon, people sprinkle perfumed water on Buddha images. After that, they sprinkle perfumed water on, or throw clean, cold water over each other. Songkran is very exciting in the North, especially in Chiang Mai.

A lot of people will go to Chiang Mai and join in the festivals there. There are a Miss Songkran Beauty Contest and a long and beautiful parade. In Bangkok, the Buddha image “Buddhasihing” is brought out from the National Museum for people to **sprinkle** perfumed water at Sanam Luang, opposite the Grand Palace. Anyone who goes out on the street is likely to get wet. People believe that water will wash away bad luck, and **splashing** water over friends or anyone will give them a New Year **blessing**.

Thai Food

The main food in Thailand is rice. Everyone eat it. But we can't really eat rice alone so we have to have something to go with it. There are many dishes of food to go with rice. Most of them are hot and spicy.

Thai people are used to eating rice with their meal. Most Thai people can't have sandwiches for their meal. They call sandwiches a snack. Thai people usually eat when they are hungry, especially kids and teenagers. If you know some Thai person, you might hear them say "Gin Khao Yung" every time you meet them. It means "Have you eaten yet?"

In Thailand, we have ๓ meals like in other countries. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are the main meals but Thai people like to have snacks between meals. A lot of snacks. We eat our meals with a spoon and fork or sometimes with chopsticks if we have noodles. All food is cut up when it is cooked so we don't need to use a knife!

In my family, we don't really cook meals ourselves. We often eat takeaway food which we bring back to the house. But if we cook ourselves, my dad will be the cook, he cooks better than my mum. We do not always have our meals together because we are not often home. I always go back home late after. On those days I usually eat at a roadside noodle stall. If I go back home early, we will eat dinner together in front of the TV. Most meals we eat are rice with meat and vegetables or noodles. Lunch and dinner are about the same but lunch usually has one dish but dinner have three or four dishes to share. It is not polite to put all food on your plate in one go. You just take a spoon full at a time. This is good when we go out to a restaurant. We can try many different dishes.
