

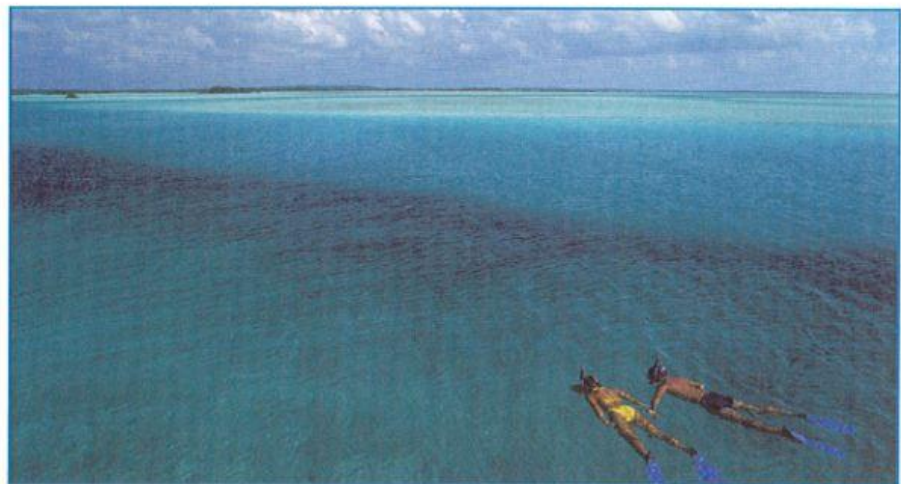

The Pacific Ocean

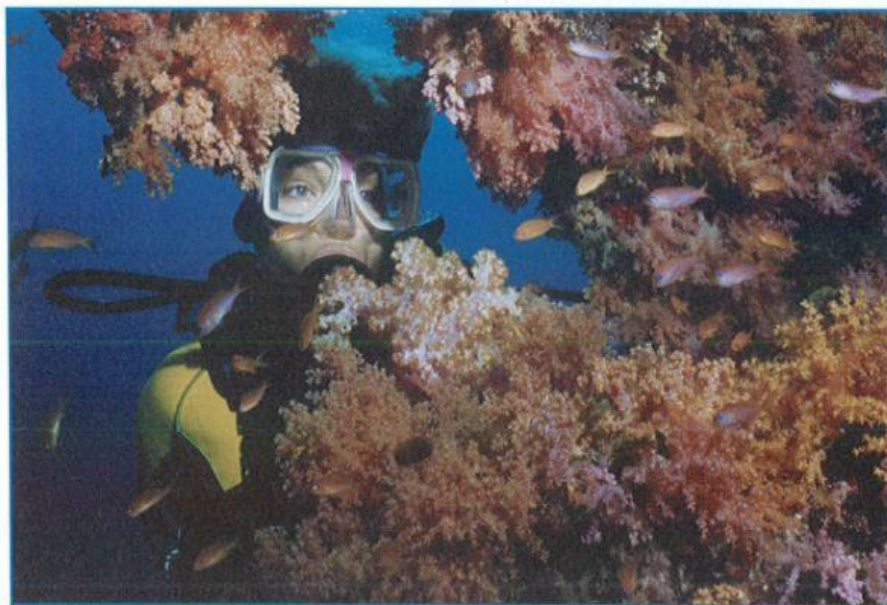
Imagine yourself on a ship. You are sailing the biggest ocean in the world. Clear blue water surrounds you. The waves are calm. Do you know where you are? You're in the Pacific Ocean.



The Pacific Ocean is the largest ocean in the world. It's where half of all the water on Earth is. The Pacific is so big that it takes a whole day for a plane to fly across it. A boat ride from one side to the other can take a few weeks. Some people prefer taking a boat though. It can be very relaxing. You can go fishing and enjoy the fresh ocean air.

Ferdinand Magellan was the first to sail across the Pacific. He also gave the ocean its name. At first, he didn't know what to call it. Should an ocean have the same name as a person? Magellan looked at the water. He watched the small, calm waves. Then he got a great idea. He named the ocean *Mar Pacifico*. In English this means **peaceful** sea.

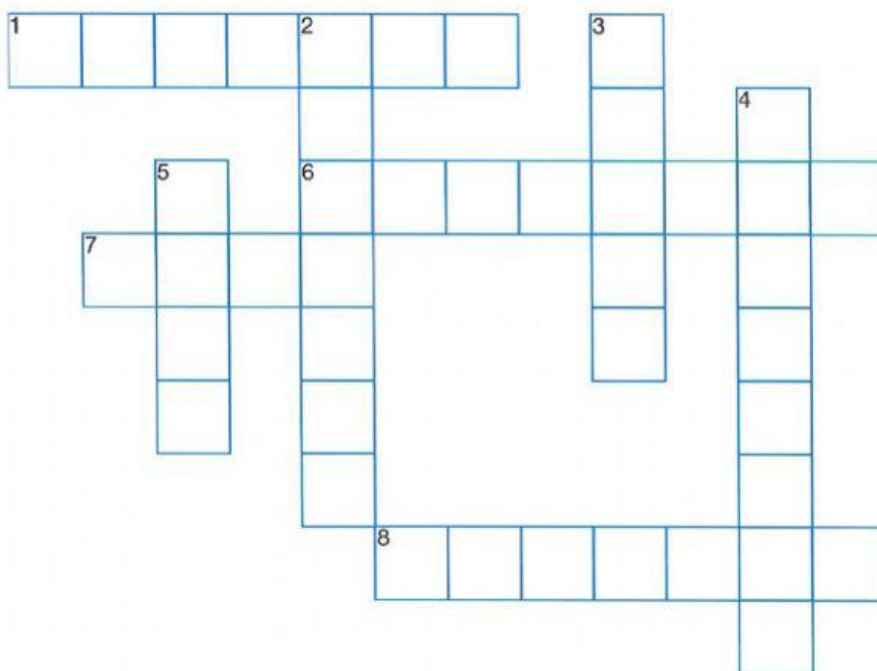
