

- We use the present continuous for things that are happening at the moment of speaking.
 - The present continuous is made from the present of the verb to be and the -ing form of a verb.
- You are reading a book.
 - When the verb ends in e, drop it and add -ing.
- He is taking off your boots. (TAKE)-(TAKING).
 - In a one-syllable verb ending in one consonant preceded by one vowel, double the final consonant.
- He is putting on their boots. (PUT)-(PUTTING)
