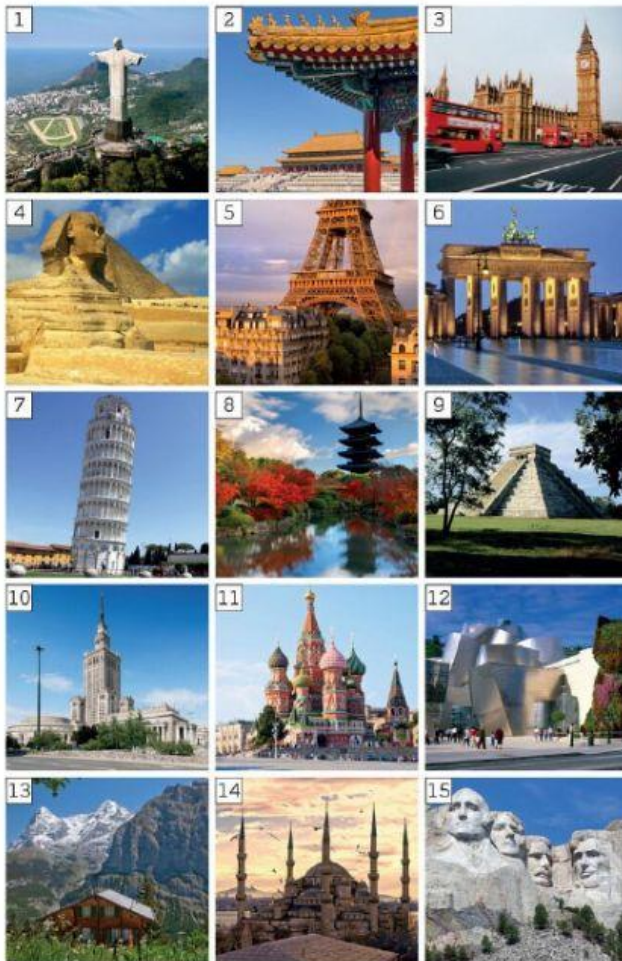

For most countries the word stress is the same on the country and the nationality, e.g. Brazil, Brazilian.

Sometimes it's different:

China → Chinese Egypt → Egyptian
Italy → Italian Japan → Japanese

Some are different, e.g.

Brazil: nationality Brazilian, language Portuguese

Egypt: nationality Egyptian, language Arabic

Mexico: nationality Mexican, language Spanish

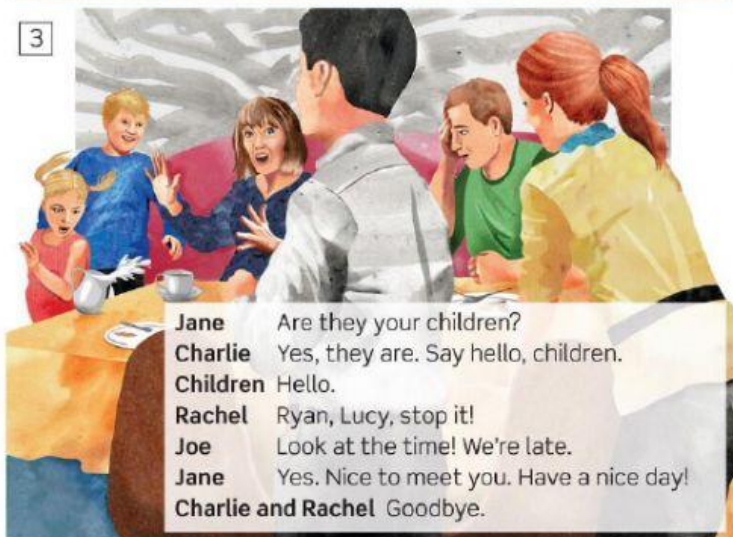
