

FRIENDLY LETTER

INSTRUCTIONS: School has closed suddenly and the country has been placed under **lockdown** due to the **Corona Virus pandemic**. As a result, you have been unable to meet and interact with your friends for over **TWO** months now. Write a letter to your **best friend** expressing how much you miss him/her and share your **experience of coping** in this present crisis. As you go about writing, please remember the following guidelines:

- Your letter must follow the **FRIENDLY LETTER** format.
- The **BODY** of your letter should be approximately **200 WORDS** in length
- Your letter should have an **INTRODUCTION**, **THREE DEVELOPING PARAGRAPHS** and a suitable **CONCLUSION**.
- Use suitable **VOCABULARY**, read over and make all necessary corrections before submission.
