commute v.	to travel to and from work regularly <i>I commute to the office by train.</i>
delay v.	to make something late or slower than expected <i>The bus to San Francisco was delayed by 30 minutes.</i>
direct adj.	going somewhere without stopping or changing direction <i>Is there a direct flight to London?</i>
intersection n.	a place where one street meets and crosses another <i>Turn right onto 21st Avenue at the intersection.</i>
on foot idiom.	by walking <i>It takes about 10 minutes on foot to get there.</i>
parking spot n.	a place to park a car <i>Look, there's a parking spot next to that red car.</i>
refund n.	money that is given back when a product or a service that was already paid for is returned or canceled <i>There are no refunds if you cancel on the day of your flight.</i>
shuttle bus n.	a bus that travels back and forth between places <i>There is a shuttle bus from the subway station to the hospital.</i>
subway n.	a train system that goes under the ground <i>I take the subway to work.</i>
traffic light n.	a red, yellow, and green light that controls vehicles on the road <i>Stop when the traffic light is red.</i>
transfer v.	to change from one vehicle or transportation line to another <i>I need to transfer buses at the next stop.</i>
vehicle n.	a machine you travel in or on, especially on roads <i>Buses, cars, trucks, and motorcycles are all vehicles.</i>

Listening Strategy: Commonly Confused Words

Same sound, different meaning

Some words in English sound the same, but are spelled differently and have different meanings. There are some things to listen for to help you decide which word you are hearing:

Context Clues

- What is the main topic of the conversation or talk? Are you hearing a word that makes sense for this topic?
- Where is this conversation or talk taking place? What kinds of words would you expect to hear in this situation?
- Who is the speaker? What would you expect this speaker to talk about?

Part of Speech

- The part of speech influences meaning. Are you hearing a verb, noun, adjective, preposition, or something else? Try to think about whether a word makes sense or not.

Ex1 **accept** (v.) sounds like **except** (prep.; conj.)

This bus **accepts** all transfer tickets. (v. to agree to take)

Trains run every day **except** Sunday. (prep. excluding)

- The cashier at the gas station didn't (**accept** / **except**) my credit card. → In this case, the verb **accept** is the only logical choice. We can **accept** a credit card. We cannot **except** a credit card.

Ex2 **buy** (v.) sounds like **by** (prep.)

It's time to **buy** a new vehicle. (v. to purchase)

Park your car **by** the gas pump. (prep. next to)

- Janet wants to (**by** / **buy**) a new car. → Here we need a verb meaning *to purchase*. Therefore, **buy** is the correct choice. A preposition for place does not make sense here.
