

SHORT ANSWERS WITH "SO" OR "NOR/NEITHER"

- We can use so (do) I and nor/neither (do) I to show that we think the same as another person.

- Use so in positive sentences when having the same feelings or experiences:

A: I love reading. / B: So do I.

- Use the same auxiliary verbs or modal verbs in the reply:

A: I am sad. A: She will skate tomorrow. A: They can run fast. A: I have eaten a lot.

B: So am I. B: So will I. B: So can I. B: So have I.

- We use nor or neither in negative sentences:

A: I don't like chocolate. / B: Nor/Neither do I.
