Muhammad Ali: The Greatest

- 1 Not everyone agrees that Muhammad Ali was the greatest boxer of all time, but he certainly is the most famous. During his career, he won three heavy-weight championships and one Olympic gold medal. However, **he** didn't just fight in the boxing ring; he was also concerned about issues such as racism, war and poverty.
- 2 He was born in 1942 in the state of Kentucky in the United States. His parents named him Cassius Clay. His father, Cassius Clay Sr., worked as a sign painter. His mother was named Odessa. **She** was a maid.
- 3 In 1964 Cassius Clay changed his name to Muhammad Ali. Many newspapers did not use his new name for several years. Perhaps they did not believe that this name change was permanent, but **it** was. By the time Muhammad Ali officially changed his religion to Islam, in 1975, he was well known by his new name.
- 4 In 1967, the United States army was fighting a war in Vietnam. **They** wanted Muhammad Ali to go to Vietnam, but he believed that the war was wrong so he refused to fight. Because of this, he was not allowed to box professionally until 1970.
- 5 After this, Muhammad Ali was allowed to continue boxing. He continued winning until 1981, when he stopped working. Since then, he has spent his time traveling and helping people all over the world. Thousands of people have benefited from Muhammad Ali's help. His contributions have been very generous. **They** include more than 22 million meals to poor people and work to support education in many countries.
- 6 Muhammad Ali has been married several times and has many children: seven daughters and two sons. His daughter, Laila Ali, became a boxer in 1999. **She** is his most famous child.
