

SIMPLE PRESENT V. PRESENT PROGRESSIVE

TASK A. Complete the sentences with **SIMPLE PRESENT** or **PRESENT PROGRESSIVE**:

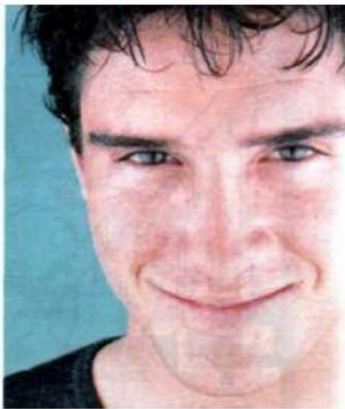
