






Miguel and Lana played at the park every day. Their father liked to read there, too.

“Let’s make posters!” said Lana. “If other people find out what’s going on, they will want to help save the park, too.”


“That’s a great idea. But we don’t have any money to buy the art supplies,” said Miguel.

► Miguel and Lana asked **customers** at Lo-Hi Foods for help.


People were happy to give money.
They wanted to save the park, too.


 The kids were able to raise enough money to buy art supplies.
