



Конструкції like doing та would like to do

Конструкція **like doing (love doing)** виражає загальне почуття вдоволення від виконаної діяльності.

I like reading. Мені подобається читати.

Конструкція **would like to do (would love to do)** виражає бажання щось зробити у момент мовлення або у найближчому майбутньому.

I would like to read. Мені б хотілось почитати.

Короткі відповіді:

Would you like to dance?

Yes, I would./ Yes, I'd love to.

Would you like to come for a walk?

Yes, I would./ No, thank you.

Потрібно зауважити, що **No, I wouldn't** зазвичай не використовується, оскільки вважається неввічливою відповіддю.
