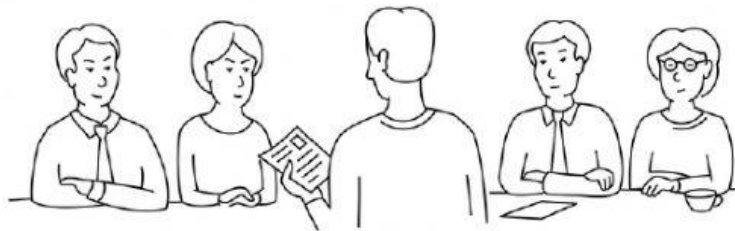
- A. In 2021, a 104-year-old Indian woman achieved something incredible: she _____¹ read and write.
