

Using A, An, and The

A, An Rules

1. Use the article "a" in front of a noun that begins with a consonant.
Example: I want a cake for my birthday.
2. Use the article "an" in front of a noun that begins with a vowel.
Example: I want an apple cake for my birthday.
3. Use "a" or "an" before nouns that are not specific or non-countable.
4. Only use with singular nouns.

"The" Rules

1. Use the article "the" in front of any noun when you want to be *specific* or indicate there is only one of thing.
Example: I want the cake with chocolate icing.
2. Use the article "the" with *plural nouns* countable and non-countable.
Example: I want all the cakes.
