GO

+ *-ing* verb

go swimming, go running, go fishing, go cycling, go shopping, go clubbing, go surfing, etc.

GO TO

+ noun
(place)

go to work, go to bed, go to school, go to university, go to prison.

GO TO A

+ noun
(place or event)

go to a restaurant, go to a spa, go to a party, go to a conference, go to a wedding, etc.

GO TO THE

+ noun
(common place)

go to the park, go to the bank, go to the dentist, go to the cinema, go to the hairdresser's, etc.

GO FOR A

+ noun
(activity)

go for a swim, go for a run, go for a walk, go for a beer, go for a massage, etc.

GO ON A

+ noun
(trip or similar)

go on holiday, go on a trip, go on a tour, go on an excursion, go on a cruise.


