What is a tag question?

A tag question is a special construction in English. It is a statement followed by a mini question.

How we use a tag question?

We use tag questions to ask for confirmation. They mean something like: "Is that right?" or "Do you agree?" They are very common in English.

Process and Resources.

A tag question is a small question that is attached, or "tagged", to the end of a sentence. Rather than repeat the main verb, a form of "be" or other auxiliary verb or modal is used in the tag. Below are a few examples.

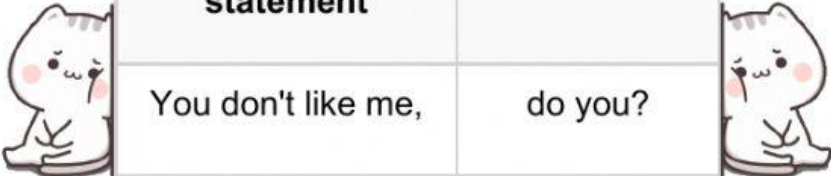
You came by train, **didn't you?** You can meet me at the station, **can't you?**

It's very windy today, **isn't it?** You couldn't give me a ride, **could you?**



The basic structure of a tag question is:

positive statement	negative tag
Snow is white,	isn't it?
negative statement	positive tag
You don't like me,	do you?
