Travel by Tube

Go to the Tate Modern and the Globe Theatre by Tube. (You can travel all day in the city center for £6.80 with an Oyster travel card.) Start from Waterloo station and walk along the River Thames. Take a picture at Tower Bridge! Go back to the center of London from Tower Hill Tube.



Travel by bike

Visit Camden by bike. Take the Tube to Aldgate station, or take the number 15 bus. Rent a bike near the station. There are over 11,500 bikes for rent in London at more than 750 bike "stations." For £2, you can make unlimited short trips for 24 hours. Cycle along the canal to Camden Market.



Travel by boat

Take a "River Bus" to the London Eye. Catch this boat at Embankment Pier and get off at London Eye Pier. A one-way ticket costs £4.20.
