USE: To talk about finished actions in the past

Subject + verb in past form
REGULAR VERBS + -d/-ed/-ied
IRREGULAR VERBS 2^o column

Examples:
I played hide and seek
They **went** home



USE: We use these expressions to talk about something that happened in the past

last	Friday/week/month/year	I watched a good film last Sunday
ago	after a period of time	We went to London three years ago
yesterday	morning/afternoon/evening	I emailed her yesterday evening

INTERROGATIVE

Did + Subject + verb in infinitive (base form)

past tense
negative form
indicates
past tense


Did she **do** the homework?
Examples: Did you **like** the film?

IMPORTANT
In questions we change the word order

Person	AFFIRMATIVE FORM	NEGATIVE FORM	INTERROG. FORM
I	was	wasn't	Was...?
YOU	were	weren't	Were...?
HE, SHE, IT	was	wasn't	Was...?
WE	were	weren't	Were...?
YOU	were	weren't	Were...?
THEY	were	weren't	Were...?
