

Regular Verbs

<u>Most verbs:</u> Add -ed	<u>Verb ends in -e:</u> Add only -d	<u>Verb ends in Consonant + Y:</u> Take off the Y + -ied	<u>Verb ends in C + V + C:</u> Double the last consonant + ed
answer - answered	arrive - arrived	carry - carried	chat - chatted
ask - asked	complete - completed	cry - cried	drop - dropped
call - called	dance - danced	hurry - hurried	plan - planned
climb - climbed	decide - decided	study - studied	stop - stopped
cook - cooked	like - liked	tidy - tidied	
enjoy - enjoyed	live - lived		
finish - finished			
help - helped			
invent - invented			
laugh - laughed			
listen - listened			
look - looked			
need - needed			
open - opened			
play - played

<u>visit</u> - visited

Attention!!!

If the verb ends in **Vowel + Y**,
you **just add -ed**:

play - **played**

enjoy - **enjoyed**

This rule usually applies to **short verbs** (= with only 1 syllable).
