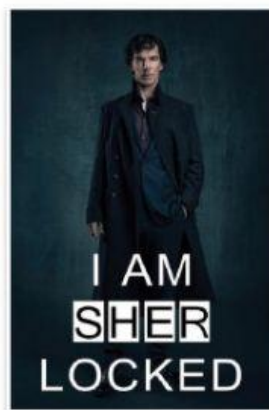
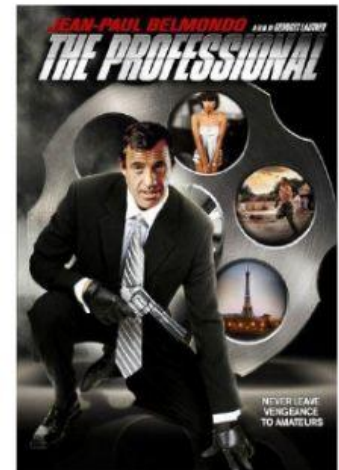

Action, dialogue, sound and music –they all work together to create an effect. In the famous shower scene Hitchcock made a dramatic decision to use no music whatsoever.

Have you ever wondered what things are used at film sets as substitutes for, say, alcohol drinks or blood? Do you have any ideas of your own? What factors has to be taken in account when using substitutes?

WHAT DO MOVIES USE IN PLACE OF ALCOHOL?

So if alcohol is not present on set, then what do movies use in place of alcohol? Well, there are a variety of “fake drink” options available, depending on the type of alcohol the beverage needs to mimic. Some examples of alcohol replacements include:

- Color dyes in flat or sparkling water for mixed drinks and cocktails
- Juice (cranberry, apple, pomegranate, blueberry, grape, blackcurrant) for wine
- Ginger ale or a mixture of sodas for champagne
- Unsweetened tea is steeped for various times or watered down to get the right color for whiskey and other brown liquor
- Regular water for vodka and other clear spirits
- Non-alcoholic beer for regular beer, and froth for

the top of beer can be made using powdered egg whites and an acid like lemon juice



The props department is responsible for purchasing non-alcoholic beverages or creating a liquid that looks close enough to the real thing and is safe for the actor to consume. There are also certain ingredients that are avoided when creating non-alcoholic beverages as they can cause problems with the actor’s speaking voice. For example, sweet or syrupy drinks and milk or chocolate-based drinks cause phlegm and make it harder for the actor to speak clearly.

Additionally, prop makers must also consider lighting for the scene and if it will impact the way the drink looks. At times, the prop maker may also have to create a drink that doesn’t need to be consumed but rather is intended to last through a long day of filming.

When people in film, television or video production talk about **Craft Services**, they're usually referring to food and drink station provided in a kind of round-the-clock buffet on set for cast and crew. People who work in a Craft Service position are considered crew members, so the person or people cleaning and stocking those tables of snacks and drinks are part of the production.
