




Listening Strategy: Similar Information in Answer Choices

In Parts 3 and 4 of the TOEIC®, questions often ask about numerical information such as times, dates, prices, etc. However, the answer choices might all include similar numbers and expressions. Listen carefully for the specific information and for the language used with the numbers.

1. Numbers and Information

If the question asks about numerical information, the answer choices may all contain similar numbers. The correct number must match the correct information.

Read the following example:

I have been a carpenter for almost 8 years. I started working in this trade when I was 22. Before that, I worked in a fast food restaurant for 4 years. In fact, while I was working at the restaurant, I met the famous carpenter Greg Simpson. He offered me a position as an apprentice, and I ended up working with him for 6 years. Sadly, Greg passed away 2 years ago.

For how long did the speaker work with Greg Simpson?

(A) 2 years

(B) 4 years

(C) 6 years

(D) 8 years

(Incorrect: Greg died **2 years** ago.)

(Incorrect: The speaker worked in a restaurant for **4 years**.)

(Correct: "I ended up working with him for 6 years.")

(Incorrect: This period of time is not mentioned.)

2. Time Prepositions

in vs. *for* + period of time

- Ex** Let's meet **in** 20 minutes. (= 20 minutes from now; future)
Let's meet **for** 20 minutes. (= for a duration of 20 minutes)

by vs. *until* + specific time

- Ex** Let's meet **by** 5:00. (= anytime before 5:00)
Let's meet **until** 5:00. (= for a duration of time that ends at 5:00)

at, *on*, and *in*

Use *at* with hours and minutes. Use *on* with days and dates. Use *in* with months.

- Ex** She always has lunch **at** noon. Everyone arrives early **on** Mondays.
The meeting is **on** the 16th. The cut-off date is **in** June.

Attention all employees. The multimedia presentation will be on Tuesday, June 5th at 3:00 p.m. The cut-off date to register for the presentation is Friday, June 1st. FYI, our receptionist, Mary, will be leaving early that day, so please talk to her by 2:00 p.m.
