structure If + subject + present simple, subject + present simple

use: general truth, scientific fact

If clause	main clause
If + Present Simple	Present Simple
condition	result

when you can use **WHEN** instead of **IF**

If it's hot, I wear shorts.
When it's hot, I wear shorts.

If you heat water, it boils (If clause, main clause)

If you heat ice, it melts (If clause, main clause)
