

# GRAMMAR

## Part 1: Defining relative clauses

A relative clause can define or identify the thing or person introduced in the main clause. It comes immediately after the person or thing it is describing.

A cheetah is an animal **that can run 100 kilometers an hour.**

The woman **who does my hair** is named Marcia.

The relative pronoun (*that, which, who*) becomes the subject of the verb in the relative clause.

You use *that* (or *which*) for things, and *who* (or *that*) for people.

subject verb

People **who come from Rio de Janeiro** are called Cariocas.

subject verb

A diner is a place **that serves food.**

◆ Relative pronouns (*who, which, whose, that*) introduce relative clauses. We use relative clauses to identify the noun in the main clause.

e.g. The man **who owns the shop** is French.

relative clause

(The relative clause identifies which man we are talking about.)
