We use to be going to to talk about things we are planning to do in the future.

NEGATIVE

TO BE (AM/IS/ARE)

(I'm/you're/she's/he's/it's/we're/they're)

Subj + to be going to + verb + complements

She's going to have dinner in a restaurant.

TO BE (I'm not/you aren't/he isn't/she isn't/it isn't/we aren't/they aren't)

Subj + to be **not** going to + verb + compl.

It isn't going to rain tomorrow.

TO BE (AM/IS/ARE)

To be + subject + going to + verb + complements.
