We use the Zero Conditional to describe a rule, something that is always true.
We use the First Conditional to talk about a future situation that is possible.
We use the Second Conditional to talk about a future situation that is unlikely to happen and to give advice.

1 Zero Conditional

- 1 bed late -> up late
If George goes to bed late, he gets up late.
2 up late -> breakfast late
3 breakfast late -> not catch bus
4 not catch bus -> work on foot
5 work on foot -> not in office before 11 a.m.
6 not in office before 11 a.m. -> boss angry
7 boss angry -> George work badly
