It marks the western end of Baku Boulevard officially opening in 2007. The square is a \_\_\_\_\_ of national pride. The giant flag which measures 70 m times 35 m on a flagpole standing 162 meters tall was featured in the Guinness world records as the world's \_\_\_\_\_ flagpole. But Baku's efforts were

overtaken in 2011 by the 165 meters Dushanbe flagpole in Tajikistan.

## 10. Baku Boulevard

The almost 3.75-kilometers Baku Boulevard hugs the Caspian Sea. The coastal promenade is home to an \_\_\_\_\_\_ park, bars, cafes, a cacti \_\_\_\_\_\_, the Baku ferris wheel and mini-Venice.
