Prepositions of time

We use **on** with days and dates.

Note: we write 22 June or 22nd June, but we say June the twenty-second or the twenty second of June.

on Tuesday/22 June/Monday evening

We use **in** with parts of the day and longer periods of time.

in the morning/the summer

We use **at** with clock times and some expressions.

at 5.15 p.m./the weekend/the moment

Saying years:

1998 = *nineteen ninety-eight*
 2007 = *twenty oh seven/two thousand and seven*

Making appointments:

Are you free ...	I'm free ...
on Tuesday?	all week.
on Wednesday morning?	on Friday.
at ten o'clock?	on Monday evening.
in the morning?	at 5.30 p.m.
next week?	in the afternoon.
